II.2) **QUANTITY OR SCOPE OF THE CONTRACT**

II.2.1) **Total quantity or scope**

Stagecoach South Western Trains Limited (SSWT) operates passenger rail services across the south and south west of England, with its hub centred at London Waterloo. This notice is for the supply and installation of Pay and Display machines to replace existing machines within SSWT station car parks.

The successful tenderer will be required to undertake a survey to confirm machine locations. Machine quantities quoted within this notice are subject to verification from the successful tenderer.

There are currently 206 Metric Pay & Display machines at 80 SSWT station car parks. All machines are powered by mains supplies, and more than 90 % accept coin payments only. Machines are not currently networked. 110 machines are older Autoslot machines, 84 are newer Accent machines, and 8 are Aura machines, the newest type on the estate.

The core option to be tendered includes:

1. Survey of existing machines to confirm locations and suitable communications options for card payments
2. Supply and installation of 116 mains powered, bank card only, pay and display machines. To replace 68 Autoslot machines and 48 Accent models.
3. Disposal of all (110) Autoslot machines
4. Relocation of 48 Accent machines, to replace Autoslot machines.

Additional options will be included within the ITT, combining the following variants:

Replacement of all existing machines - 206.

Power source - mains and / or solar.

Payment types accepted - bank card and / or coin.

Communications - networked using mobile phone technology / hardwired network / standalone.

Maintenance contract - planned preventative and / or reactive.

- (1) A copy of the candidate's three latest annual reports and audited accounts and details of any material changes in the business, corporate structure or financial standing of the candidate since the date of the last set of audited accounts or likely to take effect within the next 12 months
- (2) Statement of the overall turnover of the business of the candidate and the turnover relating specifically to provision of pay and display car park machines for the previous three financial years;
- (3) Identification of any existing financial commitments or liabilities which could impact adversely on the candidate's ability to meet this contract's requirements;
- (4) Evidence of insurances and indemnities.

In the case of a consortium candidate, equivalent details for (1) to (4) above should be provided for each member of the consortium.

III.2.3) **Technical capacity**

Information and formalities necessary for evaluating if requirements are met 1. Evidence of a previous installation of a similar number of machines (c. 115), with bank card facilities, within a similar timeframe (5 months).

2. Evidence of an installation of c. 200 machines, networked to provide centralised control and monitoring, using either mobile phone technologies and / or hard wiring.

3. Evidence of current use of solar power. SSWT are interested in exploring the option of solar powered P&D machines. Where possible, parties should provide details of an existing client using solar powered P&D machines, either in a rail station car park or similar environment, where a high proportion of customers enter the car park during early morning hours (before sunrise in Winter months). Details of example car parks should be provided, including the number of car park spaces, number of P&D machines, and number of transactions handled during a given timeframe.

SSWT have a number of car parks where 60 customers or more may purchase a ticket via a P&D machine before 9am on a given day. Similar examples should be provided.

4. Details of experience in the Railway Environment. The Railway Environment has many potential hazards and associated safety requirements not encountered elsewhere. For this reason it is preferred (but not essential), that Tenderers have previous experience working in the Railway Environment.

5. Suppliers should have a physical presence within the London and South West region for maintenance.

Evidence should be provided of existing maintenance arrangements in place with a current client/s.

6. Contact details for two to three client references should be provided. SSWT may contact referees directly during the evaluation period to obtain feedback. A brief description of services provided to the client should be provided, and where possible one reference should be for a client currently using solar powered machines.
