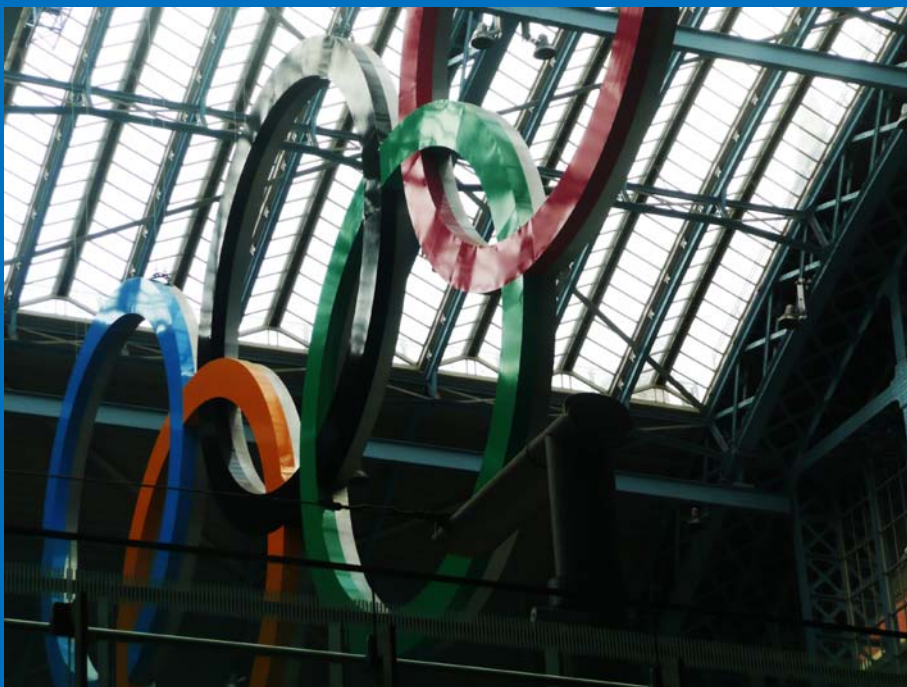

“LONDON 2012 is aiming for 100 per cent of spectators to get to the Games by public transport, or by walking or cycling”

On Thursday 29 September 2011, Transport for London and the London 2012 Olympic Games Delivery Authority will play host to the European Club of Intermodal Regions and Cities.

The large-scale **challenge**, which is dictated by the need for sustainable development and which the organisers of the Olympic Games fully intend to take up, **is that of ensuring that all Olympic Games spectators are able to make their way to all the events by public transport, bike or on foot** and that of leaving the inhabitants of East London with a legacy of intermodal infrastructures.



The **London 2012** Olympic Games represent :

- **10 million sold tickets**
- An **Olympic Park** composed of **9 sites**, as well as **14 other sites throughout London** and **9 sites outside London**
- More than **30 new bridges** in the Olympic Park alone. A footbridge formed by a **bridge that is 250 metres long and 40 metres large will constitute the main pedestrian access to the Park**
- A **complete makeover** of the transport network both around and inside the Olympic Park, within a system that **integrates all modes of transport**
- A **high speed shuttle service** providing a link between the Olympic Village and the centre of London in 7 minutes
- A **dedicated transport ticketing system**
- **Cutting edge technology** to provide information for visitors, the planning and organisation of the sites, for the management of the public address systems, and for **indispensable IT security**
- An Athletes' village within the Park that is able to host **17,000 athletes and officials**, which will provide a **long-term legacy** after the Games of **2,800 accommodation units**.
